Description of sessions

Keynote (Opening Plenary)

"Shifting the balance of power through collective action, and monitoring for accountability." An update from the UN Food Systems Summit, and comment on what comes next.

Abstract Sessions

Researchers present their *emerging* findings relating to food environments (focus on what can be relayed to policymakers *now*). Each session will begin with a methodological update from INFORMAS module leadership group members.

Format: 3 x 15 min abstracts (10 minutes + 5 minutes for discussion)

Note: the INFORMAS Secretariat panel will award a prize for the best student presentation!

Working Group Sessions

These sessions aim to provide an opportunity to bring together teams working in the various food environment monitoring domains to identify knowledge gaps and formulate new research ideas, build multi-country collaborations, and/or share tools and learning. The theme for the 2021 eSymposium series is 'Strategies and Innovation in Knowledge Translation.' The content will be tailored according to priorities identified by researchers in the region.
